 - No. An SRQ israccommended practice to support identification of McKinn fento eligible studentsListed below are several examples of audible documentation that can be used in a time of crisis or disaster to assess a student's housing status other that can be Residency Questionnai(SRQ):
 - x Googledoc/survey
 - x Intakeform
 - x Other written communication
 - x Documentation of a phone call or conversation with a schreptesentative.
- 4. Are unaccompared youth and families required to complete a Student Residency Questionnaire (SR)Qto be identified as homeless
 - No, a student can be identified as homeless even if a <u>Student Residency Questiontake</u> form, or other documents were not completed or signed by a pargenta, rdian or unaccompanied youth.
- 5. If a student isidentified and coded as homeless due to the severe winter weather when would this identification and coding need to be reevaluated?
 - A student's McKinney/ento identification and eligibility should be evaluated thually. Identification and TSDESEIMScodingare for the currentschool year and desnot carry over from yearto-year.
- 6. Are there TEHCProgramor other funding resources available to suppodentified students experiencing homelessness
 - Yes. LEAs should firstview their Title I Part A, Homeless Reservation. Title I Part A funds reserved by the LEA for services to support homeless students may occur on all campuses regardless of their Title I statusEAs



7. If a student's home was damaged due to severinter weather, should the student be coded as homeless. What criteria should be used to determine if housing is considered "substandard?"

Students and families residing in housing that has been damaged by the severe winter storm (e.g., no heat, running water, electricity, infestation with mold, etc.) can esidered to be living in a substandardiving situation and are therefore McKinneyVento eligible. Assess each student and family living situation on a calsy-case basis. Listed below are several factors to consider when determining whether housing is substandard for McKiNieen eligibility and services

- a. Lacks one of the fundamental utiles such as water, electricity, or heat due to the severewinter weather
- b. Infestation of mold or vermin
- c. Lacks functional facilities, such as a working kitchen, working toilet petc.
- d. Living conditions that may present unreasonable dangers to adults,
